36/11 Public Speaking

1. Members of the public drew the council's attention to the usefulness of the recent AVBC Neighbourhood Plan Roadshow. The likelihood of new planning guidelines and their possible impact together with thoughts as to what might replace the concept of Special Landscape Areas were of special interest. A Core Strategy was being drafted and would be published in due course. The provision of salt/grit was also raised.

2. Comments by elected County Council and Borough Council Members and Community Police Officer.

a. Cllr Jackson drew attention to the temporary closure of Ecclesbourne Lane and the initiatives of the Ecclesbourne Valley Railway. The question of industrial pig-farming was becoming a county/countrywide matter; the site at Foston being the nearest to have been resurrected recently.

b. Cllr Taylor reminded the council when a number of planning applications were to be decided.
Two: the building of a grain store and development of land at Biggin Hill were to be heard by the
Planning Board as a result of concerted public lobbying

1. Planning Applications

a. AVA/2011/0552 & 0596 – Variation and listed building consent to AVA 2010/0818 – to convert barn to form single family dwelling – Windley Barn, Wallstone Farm. PC nil objection. Approved 4 October

b. AVA/2011/0683/1021 – Two-storey extension, replacement of detached garage and landscaping – Hillside Farm, Mag Lane. PC nil objection. Approved 8th September

c. AVA/2011/0700 – Open-ended frontal steel portal framed structure – land opposite Sandhall Farm. PC objected on grounds of size in relation to use and further development of the site. Approved 22nd September.

d. AVA/2011/0770 – remove holiday cottage accommodation condition and to extend Blue Bell Barn – Alton Nether Farm. PC nil objection. Decision anticipated 11th October but still awaited.

e. AVA/2011/0615 – Agricultural building – Beighton Hill. PC strongly objected on grounds of insufficient information and supporting evidence for proposed use. Request being made for case to be referred to Planning Board for decision. Deferment agreed; decision anticipated 14th November but still awaited.

f. AVA/2011/0927-Portal frame agricultural building for use as grain store on land off B5023. PC strongly objected for reasons given in previous application, refused on appeal. Decision anticipated 14th November.

g. AVA/2011/0969- Conversion of barn into two-bedroom dwelling – Rood Lane. PC was concerned at its extreme close proximity to the neighbouring property. The council would thus urge the planning authority to ensure that no regulation concerning distances or the protection of privacy was being contravened. Further, that no wildlife such as bats, would be endangered.

2. Derbyshire Association of Local Councils

The council noted the RAD Oil Buying Scheme initiative. This was a scheme for individuals to join under a local co ordinator

40/11 Community Led Plan

To decide on further action, if any, following the RDA presentation on Community Led Plans held on the 12th October and the Neighbourhood Plan Road Show.

Resolved:

a. That following public information stemming from attendance at the AVBC Neighbourhood Plan Roadshow any formulation of a Neighbourhood Plan would be premature before the AVBC Core Plan had been completed and published. As a preliminary, however, local PC representatives and the public were to be invited to give their views on the Ecclesbourne Valley and its vital importance as a composite and living unit. The information so obtained, through the website and other means, could then be used to underline to AVBC and its Planning Authority the essential importance of retaining the concept of Special Landscape Areas and their preservation.

b. That the newly completed list of e mail addresses provided at the LED Meeting would be used primarily for promulgating information about the Neighbourhood Plan but that addressees were to

be invited to say whether or not they would wish to receive other parish information, such as notice of meetings, by this means. Whilst complementing the website it would also be a more direct method of pin-pointing important information.

41/11 Gritting

To receive a report on the Snow Warden scheme and decide whether or not to purchase additional bins.

Snow wardens had been appointed and received training. A free bin and quantity of salted grit in 20kg bags was to be supplied using Beighton Hill as the deposit site. Later distribution to strategic points and means of storage was to be decided in due course.
