The Victorians built it to last, or so they thought. Alas time, over 170 years, and the weather, has taken its toll and the spire, for example, is in need of repair. The church building has to be maintained and we have to pay for all the utilities and insurance. The support of our Friends of St James Scheme is vital in providing income to run the building and continue its maintenance to a satisfactory level. Please join the scheme. Any donation is welcome either as a one-off donation or regular yearly or monthly donations. Any amount is welcome. We are a very small congregation trying to keep open an historic building for the community. The scheme is open to all villagers and those who have connections to the church and want to see the building maintained for now and for future generations.

The church is also a hub for community use. The Alton Room is available for hire at £10 per hour. We have a kitchen, toilet and heating! Thanks to these facilities we are able to hold monthly Coffee Mornings (first Wednesday in the month 10.15 – 11.45 am) with a chance to meet and chat.
