CHURCH NEWS

Services at St James are usually held at 11.00am on the second and fourth Sunday in the month. Refreshments are served afterwards, and everyone is welcome. We've had some special services during 2019 including Candlemas, Mothering Sunday, Easter Sunday, Harvest Service and lunch. Remembrance Service and Carol Service. It's lovely to see so many people coming to these services and to see new regular members of our congregation. The Church is at the centre of the village community and keeping it open remains a priority for us all on the Parochial Church Council. It serves us for weddings (we've had 2 in 2019), Baptisms and funerals. It's a community room for the village and surrounding areas. We've held charity events and fundraisers and we act as the local polling station. To do all this we rely on an amazing group of volunteers who do what they can when they can, and any help we get is very much appreciated. Our volunteers help keep the churchyard tidy, the church clean, set up for events, sort out the flowers and generally are brilliant and we have a laugh as we work – a real community effort. Thank you. If you have any time to spare, please come and join us.

The Alton Room is available for hire at £10 per hour. We have a kitchen, toilet and heating! Thanks to these facilities we are able to hold monthly Coffee Mornings (first Wednesday in the month 10.15 - 11.45 am) with a chance to meet and chat. For anyone wishing to donate to a local food bank there is a basket for collections in church.

A request as well – we have now produced some information on 'The Roll of the Fallen in two
