NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN FINISHED!

Hooray! After very nearly two years of effort from a team of volunteers the VIA Neighbourhood Plan has been finished. The responses from our six



weeks of consultation in the summer have been incorporated into the final draft - the 'submission' version. If the Parish Council approve it at their meeting on November 12th it will then be sent to AVBC for them to take forward. This can be a lengthy process so in the meantime we are organising a pre **Christmas Social in the Alton Room** with drinks and nibbles to give everyone an opportunity to see the Plan in its final form. This will be on **Tuesday December 9th at 7.30 pm**.

Once AVBC receive the Plan they have to be sure we have sent all the documents they need and then publicise it again for a further six weeks. After this they arrange for an examination by an independent inspector. It is then possible we have to make further amendments to it before it can come back for approval by referendum of all who live in the parishes. We are hoping this referendum will take place early next year.

It seems to have been a long while and involved an immense amount of work from members of the Steering Committee for which my heartfelt thanks. The result is a Plan to retain the best of our area while allowing for the inevitable change. She and her instructor floated down to a perfect landing and she declared she'd like to do it again! Brave or stupid? You decide.
